# Ingredients for success

- All roses require some basics
  - Water
  - Good soil
  - Nutrients
  - Proper location
- Generally, won't require fungicides
- Insecticides may be required





True Bloom<sup>TM</sup> True Passion<sup>TM</sup>

## Water

- Roses need 1" to 2" a week
- Irrigation and/or overhead watering
  - To minimize fungal disease, water just after sun is hitting the roses
- Drip/leaky pipes or emitters are encouraged

## Soil

- Greatest challenge due to clay base
- Sandy loam soil texture
  - 60% sand, 20% silt, 20% clay
- Compost is king
- pH of 6.0 6.5 preferred
  - Often 7.0 or higher (both soil and water)
  - Add sulfur to lower
- Extension soil testing





## **Nutrients**

- Let your soil test be your guide
  - Nitrogen is generally needed
- Roses can be a bit needy
  - Organic
  - Synthetic
- Don't forget micronutrients






# Location, Location, Location

- At least 6 hours of full sun
- Avoid planting among tree roots
- Good drainage
- Proper hole
- Bud union below ground






# Be creative with design

  - Cottage design = English roses











# Things to remember

- Marketing happens in the rose world as well
  - "Easy care" varies by company
- Urge your local garden centers to stock what you want
- Internet suppliers may be required
  - Compare carefully sizes offered
- Isolate your new roses and treat with insecticides if needed





# Budded/grafted vs own-root

- Budded (grafted) roses purchased variety budded onto a hardy rootstock
  - Often are larger and initially grow faster
- Own-root roses are the same variety from top to bottom
  - Up to three years to reach full size







The female parent is a Polyantha rose and sometimes is identified as 'Minima'. The male parent (i.e., the pollen parent) is unknown.
